## It's Hammer Time

### Micah 6:1-8

People are fascinated with court cases. There is an abundance of judge, lawyer and criminal law shows on television. There has been much debate on whether cameras and production crews should be allowed in court rooms. They even revived the OJ Simpson court case last year some twenty years after the trial. God files a lawsuit against His covenant people – Israel. God charged the people with bad attitudes and actions towards God and their neighbor. He challenged the people to stand up before the mountains and plead their case. God called on all creation to be witnesses for Him. God opening arguments began with reminding the people of His goodness towards them. God told them how He had been their protector, defender, and provider.

Therefore, Micah the prophet tried to answer God by acknowledging the people were wrong and asked what sacrifices could they bring to worship God, to atone for their transgressions and sins? God had set up an elaborate sacrificial system for their sins. This system was an outward expression of inner trust and dependence on God for his mercy and grace. What is mercy and grace? Mercy is God holding back what we deserved. When we do not get what we deserve that is mercy. Grace is when we do not deserve a blessing but we receive one anyhow. Grace is God giving us what we do not deserve. Grace is God opening a door when we do not deserve a door being opened. We did not earn it and we did not deserve it. God's Riches at Christ Expense. God did not want sacrifices but obedience. God did not want payment but for the people, for us, to change our actions and attitude towards one another and God.

Moreover, what does the Lord require of us? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with our God. To act justly is to be fair in our dealings with one another. Biblical justice is the sorting out what rightfully belongs to whom and returning it to them. Everyone needs access to the goods and services that it takes to survive. The work of liberation, redemption, and salvation is the work of giving things back to their rightful owners. To love mercy is to have a loyal love towards one another, to desire to do no harm to our neighbors and to meet the needs of others. To love knowing we are human and can be wounded, we will suffer pain, and yet we are dependent upon our relationships. To love mercy is love tenderly with empathy and compassion. To walk humbly with our God is to be in right relationship and fellowship with our God. To radically trust God is to walk humbly with God. Walking humbly is participating in the bringing forth of God's reign here on earth. We have much work to do, let us be about it.

### God Challenges Israel

6 Hear what the LORD says:

Rise, plead your case before the mountains, and let the hills hear your voice.

<sup>2</sup>Hear, you mountains, the controversy of the LORD, and you enduring foundations of the earth; for the LORD has a controversy with his people, and he will contend with Israel.

<sup>3</sup>“O my people, what have I done to you? In what have I wearied you? Answer me!

<sup>4</sup>For I brought you up from the land of Egypt, and redeemed you from the house of slavery; and I sent before you Moses, Aaron, and Miriam.

<sup>8</sup>He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the LORD require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?
